# Enjoy the Arigna Mining Experience

Definitely one of Ireland's hidden treasures, the Arigna Mining Experience Centre in Co. Roscommon, is a wonderful day out for all age groups. Indeed it's a must for anyone with an interest in the history of Ireland's coal mining industry.

Associated with mining for around 400 years, Arigna became the first major power-generating station in Connacht, set up by the ESB in 1958.

Thankfully the Arigna Mining Experience Centre now preserves the energy heritage of this area, and allows visitors from both home and abroad an insight into coal mining life in the Arigna Valley from the 1700s until its closure in 1990. And the centre's ideal location in the midlands makes it eas-

ily accessible for holidaymakers from all over the country.

A typical visit includes a 45-minute underground tour, with sound and lighting effects for an authentic mining experience! In fact visitors will experience what it was like to work in some of the narrowest coal seams in the Western world, and discover the methods used to extract coal.

In the exhibition space, visitors learn about local geology and the formation of coal deposits is explained, while an excellent photo archive is on-show.

The exhibition also explains the concepts and operation of different renewable energy systems, some of which can be viewed in operation in the Energy Centre Building, in the energy playground and on the nearby wind farms.

Other facilities include a coffee shop and gift shop.
