Urges appear in The Coachman's

The Melting Pot, a non-profit charity shop and café that provides training and support for people with physical and mental disabilities is looking to put on bigger events in an effort to increase its funding.

With this the Melting Pot has teamed up with The Dogs B*ll*xs to put on a number of promotions and the first of these will be at The Coachman's Inn, Roscommon, on May 28th from 10 pm to 1 am with Dublin band The Urges.

The Urges started out in a garage in late 2004. With little or no musical knowledge they set out to write nothing but stripped down raw rock and roll. Heavily influenced by every major psychedelic band from the 60's and early 70's such as Electric Prunes, The Doors, and The Pretty Things, they have gone on to produce off their own back their first single Around and Around and Around Again which topped the Irish charts in 2005.

After two years of gigging around Dublin and the festival scene in Spain and Portugal, the group was invited to record an album in Portugal, which became the album Psych Ward. Since then, the group has played with such big names as Wild Billy Childish, Paul Weller, The Buzzcocks, Kulashaker, Baby Shambles, Ocean Colour Scene, The La's and just about every garage band since the 60's.

In the last two years The Urges have been playing most major festivals throughout Europe including an appearance at Oxegen in the same line up as David Bowie, PJ Harvey, Kings of Leon and The Strokes. In early 2009 they were invited to play the twelve-date tour of Music Hall of Williamsburg in New York City then on to Mexico City for two dates and the remaining nine dates where in Austin Texas in the southern United States. In 2008 The Urges were signed by Wicked Cool Records and their album was re-released on to the world market. The Urges effortlessly drift in and out of different timings and melodies but constantly maintain an authentic yet primitive sound which always leaves the crowd crying for more. When it comes to live shows The Urges don't resort to filling a set with plagiarised riffs and shoe gazing, their performances are both primal and chaotic emanating a threat of violence which makes the men stand back and makes the girls step forward!

The Urges will be performing for one night only at The Coachman's Inn, Castle Street, Roscommon Town; on the 28th of May tickets (€10) they are available at the following venues; The Melting Pot Café, The Coachman's Inn and Molloy's off license.
