From Ros to Moldova!

Mairead McGuire from Croghan and Martina and Marie Carroll from Tulsk, Co. Roscommon are travelling to Moldova on the 28th of June to work in an orphanage with Outreach Moldova. The orphanage is situated near the town of Hincesti, 50km from the capital city Chisinau. It is dedicated to providing human rights, medical care and social inclusion for children that have been abandoned or orphaned, children with special needs and/or terminal illnesses.

Outreach Moldova (ORM) is an Irish Charity with its head office in Dublin and has been operating for 10 years. It was founded after seeing firsthand the horren-

dous conditions that children at Hincesti Orphanage lived in. Since then, ORM and its dedicated staff work 365 days a year, 24 hours a day with hundreds of children who have been simply discarded by all except the state. In the 10 years since its establishment, Outreach Moldova has given strength to many children's voices; however, many have yet to be heard.

The three girls, all local teachers, will work alongside other volunteers and Moldovan staff in the orphanage. During their time there, the girl's day will be very varied. It will include taking part in child-orientated activities, assisting children confined to wheelchairs and helping to feed

the many children that cannot eat independently.
