Big Generator return to Rockfords Niteclub

Galway-based band Big Generator return to Rockfords this Saturday night, April 24th.

The band features Paul Cantillon on vocals and bass guitar; Barry Conboby on lead guitar; Liam Martin on vocals, guitars and keyboards and Alan 'Mac' McEvoy on vocals and drums.

After five top twenty hits, two albums, numerous tours in Holland, Germany, England, Sweden and America, they bring their high power show to Rockfords.

The lads have been on top of the pile for many years now, still the band that all the young newcomers aspire to. Big Generator came into the picture at a time when the live music circuit was a badly wounded animal, and they are in no small part responsible for the thriving scene which is in place today. Life on the road has its moments. Just to give you an idea of the sort

of strange and wacky things that can happen to a full-time touring band, this year alone the following incidents took place: One of the band's roadies was chased down a street in Longford late one night by a psychopath wielding a chainsaw! A chainsaw that was turned on! The guy was slightly upset at not being allowed into a fast food joint! On a boat trip to Holland, the ferry had to take a slight detour! Due to gale-force conditions the lads ended up having to sail up near the coast of Norway to calmer waters, before making the rollercoaster trip down to Holland. They were on the ship for 19 hours a ship they now lovingly refer to as the Vomit Comet.

The lads met a man claiming he was Elvis outside a venue one night, a drunk man of about 60. When the lads accepted his kind offer to sign autographs for them, he then asked them, 'How
