Sliabh Bán campaign goes virtual

The campaign against plans by Coillte to locate twenty 112-metre wind turbines on Sliabh Bán has gone virtual, with a facebook campaign now underway to oppose the plans.

Semi-state forestry company, Coillte, plans to apply for planning permission to erect 20 wind turbines on Sliabh Bán, the tallest peak in Co. Roscommon.

A spokesperson for the campaign opposing the plans stated, "The proposed turbines will each be 112 metres tall, on a mountain where the highest point is 262 metres above sea level. The N5 main road passes alongside Sliabh Bán, and every day many hundreds of potential tourists get panoramic views of the mountain as they drive between Tulsk and Tarmonbarry. During the summer months cruise boats on the Shannon River also get fine views of the mountain.

"Already money has been spent developing tourism on Sliabh Bán. There are eight miles of sign-posted walkways, a picnic area, public seating, and a tourist brochure has been produced. Currently, walkers, cyclists, runners,

horse riders and sports groups all regularly visit Sliabh Bán. From the mountain's highest point it is possible to see fourteen of Ireland's counties, and on a clear day you can see as far away as Croagh Patrick."

Opponents of Coillte's plans say that the siting of wind turbines on the mountain will deter tourists, turning the area into an industrial landscape. "The environmental impact of constructing a wind energy site on a mountain like Sliabh Bán is an important issue. The concrete bases of each turbine will require at least 450m3 of concrete, resulting in at least 1600 truck journeys carrying concrete up the mountain. There may be a risk of landslides due to construction of this magnitude.

"At this stage Coillte has said that they will be applying for planning permission in the third quarter of 2010. It is important that people in Roscommon and Longford, who see the mountain every day, express their concern about the proposed wind farm. Please feel free to contact the Sliabh Ban Community Group to make your views known. Coillte's wind energy proposal will define the future of Sliabh Bán as an industrial site, and considerably limit the amenity and tourist value of the mountain."

Break-ins in Boyle

Two cars were broken into in Boyle over the last seven days and a small amount of cash was stolen on both occasions. On the 25th July a car was broken into in Abbeytown between the hours of 5.15 pm and 7.45 pm while another car was broken into in the Forest Park between the hours of 11.30 am and 11.45 am.

Gardaí in Boyle are appealing for any information that the general public may have concerning the incidents and are also warning the public to be vigilant in future as there have been a spate of car break-ins over the last number of weeks.

President escapes injury in car accident

The President's car collided with another vehicle at a junction in the townland of Woodbrook near the President's holiday home in Cootehall, Co Roscommon. The occupants of the other vehicle also escaped injury, according to a spokesman from Boyle Gardaí. It is understood that the accident occurred just after 2 pm Saturday and the President was not on official duty at the time. Gardaí in Boyle are continuing to investigate the incident.
