Declaration of a Public Road

Roscommon County Council proposes to declare the following roads to be public roads:

- Roads Located within housing development at "Meadowvale", Greatmeadow Townland, Boyle, Co Roscommon.
- Accommodation Road at Currinah Townland, Ballaghaderreen, Co Roscommon constructed in conjunction with N5 Charlestown, By-Pass

Maps showing the roads to be taken in charge may be inspected at the Offices of Roscommon County Council, Courthouse, Roscommon and the Local Area Engineers Office in Boyle and Ballaghaderreen respectively during the period from Monday 31st May, 2010 to Wednesday 30th June, 2010.

Objections or representations may be made in writing to Roscommon County Council in relation to such declarations not later than 4.00 p.m. on Wednesday 14th July, 2010.

Notice of a decision to close road.

Roscommon County Council hereby gives notice that it has made a decision to close the undermentioned road to public traffic from Monday 31st May 2010 until Monday 28th June 2010 to facilitate the laying of water mains on the Clooneygrasson Group Water Scheme.

L1630-30 (Slieve and Corbally 3 roads to Leamore) from its junction with L-66292-0 at Slieve and Corbally to L1630-61 at Leamore.

Alternative Westbound Route from L1630-30 to L1630-61 at Leamore.

Take L66292 from Emlaghglasny junction with Slieve and Corbally to N60 at Bellacagher and then N60 to junction with L1634-0 at Cloonagrassan.

Alternative Eastbound Route from L-1630-61 at Leamore to L1630-30 at Slieve and Corbally.

The above route in reverse order.

Emergency and local access will be provided. Diversions will be signposted.

Launching the glossy 96-page journal, Mr. Miley said that it was an invaluable publication, "the real importance of which is that it tells the story of Roscommon life and will be there for all time to be cherished by readers everywhere."

The Dublin launch was attended by members of both the Roscommon Association in Dublin and the Roscommon GAA Supporters Club (Dublin). Also present were

a number of special guests and Dublin-based Roscommon folk.

Dail Deputies Denis Naughten and Frank Feighan were present, as was Senator Terry Leyden. Dublin-based Deputy Terence Flanagan (whose father Michael is a native of Castlerea) attended, as did Dublin-based councillors Declan Flanagan (brother of Terence) and Lettie McCarthy.

All of the politicians present congratulated Editor Paul Healy on this year's publication and also commended the work of Contributing Editor Mike Lennon and his colleagues in the Roscommon Association (Dublin).

'Roscommon Life 2010' was launched locally in the Co. Library, Roscommon last night, Wednesday May 26th. The book will now go on sale in local outlets.

This is the 30th annual edition of the Roscommon Yearbook, which was first published in 1980, having been initiated by Ballinlough native Michael Fitzmaurice. Mr. Fitzmaurice was present at the Dublin launch with his wife Attracta and many tributes

were paid to his great work in promoting Roscommon over the years.

Well-known Shannonside Radio Sports commentator Willie Hegarty was a special guest at the 'Roscommon Night' themed launch and his overview of the state of Roscommon football provided the basis for an invigorating and sometimes robust series of exchanges with members of the audience.

County Librarian Mr. Richie Farrell highlighted the upcoming Percy French Summer School at Castlecoote House (14th-21st July 2010). Speaking on behalf of Roscommon County Council, he said he fully supported 'Roscommon Life', which he described as an important cultural reference point.

Paul Healy, Editor of Roscommon Life, outlined some details of the content of the publication and also paid tribute to the role of Michael Fitzmaurice in creating the book back in 1980. He thanked Mike Lennon for his great assistance in sourcing articles and acknowledged the vital support of advertisers.
